
#### What does the role involve?

#### **Overview**

This is an exciting time to be joining us as we're in the middle of our 2022-2027 Strategy, which included several new activity areas and the launch of new funding schemes. We are committed to investing over £150 million in new projects over the period in key areas of research and healthcare. We've already made a great start – in two years, we have awarded over £70m to support improvements to healthcare and transformative research for local health benefit in East London.

#### Job purpose

The Funding Manager (Healthcare) role will be key in making sure we fund impactful healthcare projects. This includes facilitating the assessment and funding of new grants, managing a proportion of our current healthcare funding portfolio, and contributing to monitoring progress of a range of healthcare projects. You will work closely and build relationships with the healthcare professionals and researchers at Barts Health NHS Trust and the Faculty of Medicine and Dentistry at Queen Mary University of London.

## **Key role deliverables**

- Manage and deliver the grant application process across the breadth of our healthcare grants, including assessing and carrying out due diligence against scheme criteria.
- Lead on the running and delivery of a subset of funding schemes, with Head of Healthcare Funding oversight.
- Ensure suitable information is available for advisory and decision-making meetings associated with healthcare-related grants including the preparation of committee papers.
- Be responsible for ensuring high-quality advice is sought on healthcare funding requests, e.g. through formal partner groups, external peer-review, expert opinion, Barts Charity Everyday Impact Advisory Panel.
- Assess and facilitate progress of awarded Grants though contact with Grant holders, partner stakeholders and through Barts Charity's monitoring and impact process.
- Work closely with the Director of Funding & Impact and Head of Healthcare Funding to support our strategy delivery, and underlying delivery plans, in the area of Healthcare Funding.
- Represent the Charity at external meetings, promote the Charity's funding schemes, opportunities and strategy within Barts Health and network with external stakeholders and other external organisations to help deliver Barts Charity's goals.

## **Key experience (essential)**

- You will have a degree in a STEM/public health/healthcare related subject or equivalent experience
- You will have experience of supporting the development of successful projects, ideally within a NHS/healthcare setting or Higher Educational Institute (HEI).
- You will have experience of grants administration/management/operations in a healthcare, academic, funding agency or charity setting.

#### **Key skills (essential)**

- You will have excellent communication and interpersonal skills alongside the ability to build strong relationships with health professionals and healthcare delivery staff.
- You will have strong organisational, planning and time management skills.
- You will have high level of attention to detail and be able to undertake critical analysis of potential funding proposals.
- You will be able to problem solve, sometimes in a challenging and fast paced environment.
